

INFORMATION OBLIGATION

Processing of Personal Data

(Annex to the Conference Rules)

Pursuant to Article 13 of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation, hereinafter referred to as the "GDPR"), the Jagiellonian University hereby informs that:

1. The controller of the personal data of Conference Participants is the Jagiellonian University, ul. Gołębia 24, 31-007 Kraków, represented by the Rector of the Jagiellonian University.
2. The Jagiellonian University has appointed a Data Protection Supervisor. The Inspector can be contacted by email: iod@uj.edu.pl or by phone at 12 663 12 25 – Monday through Friday, from 8:00 AM to 3:00 PM.
3. The Participant's personal data will be processed for the following purposes:
 - a) the performance of the contract, the subject of which is participation in the conference **“6th Jagiellonian Symposium on Advances in Particle Physics and Medicine (JS:2026)”**, as well as for the purpose of registering participation in the Conference based on the contract concluded through acceptance of the Regulations (Article 6, paragraph 1, letter b) of the GDPR). The Conference will be held on-site from July 5-10, 2026;
 - b) conducting Photo and Video coverage of the Conference for documentation, information, educational, teaching, promotion of the Jagiellonian University, and the Conference itself, and archiving purposes. In relation to Participants' personal data in the form of an image, permission has been granted in accordance with the Act on Copyright and Related Rights pursuant to Article 6(1)(e) of the GDPR, i.e., in the public interest, which is the organization of conferences and other events by a higher education institution in connection with Article 11 of the Act on Higher Education and Science.
 - c) ensuring the security of the Conference in accordance with the Video Surveillance Regulations applicable at the Jagiellonian University, available at <https://bip.uj.edu.pl/>, and the information obligation regarding image processing in video surveillance, available at <https://iod.uj.edu.pl/monitoring-wizyjny>, pursuant to Article 6(1)(e) of the GDPR. The GDPR – in relation to data from video surveillance
4. Providing personal data by the Participant:
 - a) with regard to the data referred to in point 3(a) above is necessary to conclude the contract and participate in the Conference.

b) in relation to the data referred to in point 3(b) above, is voluntary.

c) in relation to the data referred to in point 3(c) above, is voluntary, but failure to provide it – due to the obligation to ensure Participants' safety – will result in the inability to participate in the Conference.

5. Personal data of the Participant provided in the registration form will not be disclosed to third parties. The Participant's personal data in the form of image may be recorded in photographs or videos from the Conference and processed on the Jagiellonian University's websites and social media profiles in a manner allowing access by third parties, for purposes related to the promotion of the University, including event coverage, in accordance with § 5(1–5) of the Regulations.

6. The recipients of the Participant's personal data are entities providing IT support for the organization of the Conference – including the entity providing software for event registration.

7. The Participant's personal data provided in the registration form will be processed until the end of the Conference, and then for the limitation period for claims that may arise from participation in the Conference. The Participant's personal data, in the form of an image, will be processed as part of photo and video reports and recordings from the Conference on the Jagiellonian University website and Jagiellonian University profiles on social media until the Participant objects. Data from video surveillance will be processed for a maximum of 3 months.

8. The Participant has the right to obtain information about the processing of personal data and the rights arising under the GDPR, the right to access their data and to rectify it, as well as the right to erasure of personal data from the controller's records (unless further processing is necessary for compliance with a legal obligation or for the establishment, exercise, or defence of legal claims), and the right to restriction of processing, data portability, and to object to processing, in the cases and under the conditions specified in the GDPR.

9. Participants' personal data will not be subject to automated decision-making or profiling.

10. Participants have the right to lodge a complaint with the President of the Personal Data Protection Office if they believe that the processing of their personal data violates the provisions of the GDPR.
